Former VIA Supported Worker Appointed as President of PNGUM

What a humbling yet joyful experience it is to see VIA-supported workers being given responsible positions in the mission fields. Pr Malachi Yani worked as a layperson in 1998-1999 under the sponsorship of his local churches. He then went on to complete his ministerial studies at Sonoma.



When the West New Britain Province mission was struggling financially, VIA stepped in and provided some double stipends to keep pastors employed, including Pr Yani. Malachi went on to be the President of the Western Highlands Mission and was elected as President of the whole PNG Union Mission in November 2020.

In a recent email to VIA founder Cliff Morgan, Malachi commented, "Those formative years of my ministry were important, and I want to thank our Laities in Australia who invested meaningfully toward Human Resources as well as infrastructure developments in PNG and abroad. God Kept Me Alive So I Could Find His Truth

Stephen Lenga doesn't know exactly when he was born. "Sometime between 1920 and 1924", he says, during the time when Christianity was first starting to be introduced into his country. As an infant he was baptized in the Toge Anglican church and later married a woman from his congregation.



He remembers helping the Australian soldiers during World War II, lifting and carrying supplies over rugged terrain. Stephen and his wife went on to have eight children, and he now has 61 grandchildren and 75 great-grandchildren! His wife passed away many years ago and he wondered why God had kept him alive so long. Then in 2020 he felt he had discovered the reason. He and one of his sons were contacted by a VIA missionary and on the 3rd of October 2020, they, along with his son's wife and four children, were baptized in Buma village. They are currently the only Adventists in their area and are praying that a small church will be built there in the near future.

Ministry Continues Despite Tragedy

Robert Abiya lives in his wife's Yongale village between the borders of Enga and Hela Provinces in the PNG Highlands. It is very isolated, and the little band of members were forcefully scattered abroad by tribal fighting. Robert and his wife were left alone but they were determined to witness.



One day Robert went looking for bush materials for the church. His wife, carrying their three-month old son, later followed her husband. As she crossed Wake River alone, she used one hand to hold her baby, and the other to support herself. While in the middle of the river, she stepped over a slippery stone and lost hold of her sleeping baby causing it to fall into the fast-flowing river, never to be seen again in this life.

There the helpless mother wept alone. Some boys discovered the weeping mother and delivered the heart-rending news Robert who was shocked. The news spread to Robert's relatives and the whole tribe, armed with fighting gear, headed to Robert and his wife demanding compensation because they had paid bride-price to the woman's relatives knowing she would bear children for their tribe. Their claim wasn't accepted, and it triggered massive destruction of houses and food gardens.

Robert and his wife, knowing that God still cares for them, continued their ministry and completed the church. Many people from the area have responded positively to an evangelistic series, and three other denominations freely provided food and firewood during the outreach programs. Many have been baptized.

This year Robert was recommended for VIA sponsorship and the local Mission happily agreed. Thank you, VIA donors, for your support which makes all of this beautiful ministry possible.

Solomon Islands Church Roofing

In 2020, VIA and Solomon Islands Mission (SIM) undertook the roofing of 15 churches under the guidance of Pastor David Filo, Assistant General Secretary of SIM. One of the churches was Judea Church and their report highlights how God worked through the local members, VIA Bible worker Dickson Olofa and evangelist Mauta Kemuel, and how a whole community bonded together around the church building project and saw many conversions.

An added gift was that after the evangelistic campaigns, the whole village changed their United Church into a Seventh-day Adventist Church!

The other interests who are yet to be baptised are undergoing Bible studies. The difficulty that they face is the challenge to stop farming pigs (main income), betelnut chewing and smoking of safusafu (home tobacco). However, we see that God is working in their lives and a change in their lifestyle is evident.

Today, 70 precious souls worship under their new roof each Sabbath and many more are in baptismal classes. We hope you enjoy these progress photos.

Singing to Save

VIA John Tori of Darione Church, Solomon Islands Mission, has a passion for reaching young people, especially 'missing members', those who used to be members of the Seventh-day Adventist Church. In the Solomon Islands, people love to sing and so John has set up a singing ministry especially for young people. They meet regularly to sing and study and socialize. Towards the end of 2020 he ran a Singing Camp for the young people who had been attending, and at the conclusion nine requested baptism. Of these, five were 'missing members'. John praises God for his goodness in bringing His children home!



"I Choose God, No Matter What"

During an evangelistic series run by VIA Joe Mahit in Vanuatu, it came to his attention that a young woman was attending against her father's wishes. Twenty-one-year-old Mothy Belcim had been forbidden to go to the Adventist meetings, but she was so hungry for this message that she came anyway, hiding as best she could in the crowd, night after night. But when Joe made his first appeal at the conclusion of a meeting, Mothy knew she couldn't hide anymore and she bravely stood up, knowing this news would quickly get back to her father. She knew there was a beating waiting at home for her.

At the conclusion of the meeting Joe and several church members prayed with Mothy and it was decided that the village chief, who was sympathetic to her situation, would accompany her home. He informed her father that he had no right to beat her up, but he wouldn't listen. After the chief left, he grabbed Mothy and beat her badly. Hearing her cries, the chief returned, breaking into the house to rescue her. She was taken to hospital with injuries to her head. Her father was taken to the police station.

In spite of everything that had happened to her, this brave young woman was determined to follow Jesus, and stood again when Joe Mahit made his next appeal at the evening meetings. She was recently baptized in a beautiful Sabbath morning service and has been faithfully attending her local church since then.

Devil Priest's Daughter Requests Baptism

After the program someone called for their help as the devil priest's daughter (3rd from left), was in a fit and couldn't walk.



Jack and his group carried her to their church nearby and prayed with her. He then inquired with her father about what had happened. The devil priest informed him that she had disobeyed the devil's rules and that was why she was so unwell. The young woman was taken to the local clinic and after much prayer, she recovered from her illness.

A few weeks later Pr William Akomne conducted a one-week campaign at Felafauru village and when he made his appeal for people to give their hearts to Jesus, this young woman came forward to join baptism classes. She is now waiting for a time when

a pastor will be available to come and baptize her.

Great Harvest Amidst Tribal Fighting

The dedication program of VIA Isaiah Otingau's 'hand church' at Andafuka, East Sepik Province, PNG, was disrupted by a tribal fight between two clans. During the clash two men were killed and one was admitted to hospital with gunshot wounds, but even this didn't stop the dedication program going forward so that ground for God could be claimed in that troubled village. During the program four people were baptized. Isaiah hopes that he and the new members of the Otingau church will be able to reach out to the warring clans with a message of God's love and peace.

Isaiah held a weeklong evangelistic series in a nearby village, Yambimbot. He had recently planted another hand church in the area and prayed that God would bring many 'missing members' and new believers into the new church. His prayers were answered in a mighty way. Hundreds of people attended the meetings and at the conclusion when he made the appeal, 105 precious individuals gave their lives to Jesus. Twenty-five were 'missing members' and 58 asked to be baptized. Praise God for His goodness and for Isaiah's faithfulness!

My New Friend Saved my Dad!

Emmuel Kavu, a Simbu Mission VIA missionary, likes to spend time in his community, meeting new people and finding out where the greatest needs are. One day he befriended a four-year-old boy who seemed to need care. The boy took him home to meet his father who was suffering with severe drug addiction.



Over a period of many weeks, Emmuel ministered to the boy and his father, bringing them food and praying with them. The man was able to overcome his addiction through the power of the Holy Spirit and Emmuel had the thrill of seeing his new friend baptized just a few months ago! All because he took the time to be a friend to a lonely little boy.

Live Broadcasting Sees 17 Baptised



VIA missionary, Edsen Rintu has facilitated a Live Broadcast Evangelistic series in the small Sunlight Community, with a population of about 200 people. At the conclusion of the three-week program in the King George Market, 17 people decided to give their lives to Jesus and were baptized. Many more stood up during the meeting to show their request for further Bible study and visitation.

Edsen is confident there will be more baptisms soon. He says that the greatest challenge their small church faces is the nurturing and training of newly baptized members so they can learn to disciple others to follow Jesus.

Shiloh Centre Shows God's Love in Action

The Seghe Hand Church in the Solomon Islands, set up by VIA missionary Graham Varane, has become a community care centre. People know that they can seek help at 'Shiloh', the name Graham gave to God's building. Here he oversees the distribution of care to the homeless, to the hungry, to widows and even offers his services to help settle differences between village members. Clothes, food, gardening services and shelter are offered to anyone who needs them. Graham says that he just wants to "comfort those who are in sorrow, sad and whose lives are incomplete."



Shiloh is indeed a light of God's love and care in this part of the Solomon Islands, and 23 people have been baptized as a result of the love they have felt.

Even Stoning Can't stop this VIA Preacher!

Hela Province of PNG is a rather volatile place to be a missionary. The constant tribal fighting is often punctuated with gunshots, and many people are injured and killed every month. VIA volunteer Ben Luke describes it as "a very difficult place" yet he quickly adds, "But my God has blessed me richly and I thank Him always!" Ben preaches in public places and he has brought many souls to baptism.

Ben finds it particularly difficult to share in areas where other church denominations have a stronghold, but he preaches anyway. Twice he has been stoned and once they grabbed his microphone and broke it. God has blessed his boldness and in the last half of 2020, six people were baptized as a direct result of his preaching. At the moment Ben praises God that he also has 30 people in baptismal classes.

No-One Could Stop the Preaching

For two weeks in late October 2020, VIA missionary Clifton Bakale Luda conducted an evangelistic campaign at Takawa Catholic Station in the Solomon Islands. The Takawa Catholic parish priest forbade his congregation and their families from attending, claiming that it was "Satanic and heretical", but when the evening meetings started the seats were filled with children and young people. The adults stood in the dark and listened.

On the second week when Clifton started to preach on the Three Angel's Messages, interest soared. People were hearing new things that cut straight to their hearts.

In desperation the parish priest called the parish council together for an urgent meeting. They could find no valid reason to stop the Adventist campaign, so decided to use force, threatening that if the Adventist meetings didn't stop then the stage would be damaged and harm might come to the presenters.

When the landlord of the building in which the campaign was being held heard about these threats, he confronted the parish priest and the council, informing them that they had no right to stop the preaching of God's word. The Landlord declared that it was better for the people to listen to the word of God than to be partying, getting drunk and abusing drugs—their usual Friday night activities.

At the end of the campaign, 21 people came forward to be baptized, including the Youth Leader of the Catholic Church. Praise God that there are now three branch Sabbath Schools in the Takawa Catholic Community, and 18 more people have requested Bible studies. What a God we serve!
