Cliff Morgan – A Life Well Lived

(22 April 1934 – 18 April 2026)

Charles James Clifford Morgan was born on 22 April, 1934 to Charlie and Kath Morgan during the impacts of the Great Depression. His parents ran a dairy farm at Greycliffe and lived in a bag and corrugated iron hut home. Growing up on the farm was spartan but healthy – lots of fresh air, lots of chores, lots of animals and lots of sport.

After leaving school, Cliff went to Avondale College to study Accountancy. He was baptised in 1952 and graduated in 1954. During his time there he met a young lady name Valerie Hartley who studied Business & Commerce. Here began a lifelong friendship. A month after Val's 21st birthday they got married in Wallsend Adventist church. They spent the first few years of married life caring for the farm at Greycliffe.

In 1958 they lived in Alderley and Cliff commenced studying at Brisbane Teachers' College and they had their first son, Tony. In 1961 Geoffrey was born and Derek made the family complete in 1965. Cliff and Val were both very involved in the Mitchelton SDA church and later active in Pathfinders.

Cliff taught Humanities and became Geography Master at school. In addition to his classroom job, Cliff took on extracurricular tasks as sports coach of several teams. Cliff was very committed to fitness,

and he coached the school basketball team and coordinated athletics training. Cliff and his sons were regular winners of many cross-country races and fun runs.

Cliff was very social. He would strike up a conversation with a stranger, seek out the 'underdog' to include in the group and would often invite visitors at church home for lunch. Val always willingly obliged.

Other than Val, Cliff had two great loves – family and God. When Cliff sadly passed to his rest the family had grown to include nine grandchildren.

Cliff retired mid-1989, aged 55 and volunteered for 12 months at Pacific Adventist College just outside Port Moresby in PNG. He had already coordinated a few Fly and Build projects to various South Pacific countries. Just days before he passed away on April 18th, Cliff shared with his son Tony, "My love language is 'acts of service'". How true that was!



Cliff had a huge heart for service and helping others. He always served in leadership roles at church, founded the Volunteers in Action (VIA) mission program with Val, and always shared and showed his love for God to others. Cliff was a great example of what a true Christian man of integrity looks like.

Our readers all know VIA very well, but did you know that in the 25-year period when Cliff and Val directed this ministry, over \$14 million was raised to fund 400-500 bible workers every year, in PNG and the islands of the South Pacific? And it is still going strong under God's watch care today with 450+ workers sharing God's love and truth every day.

And did you know that, over a period of 20 years, on average, VIA provided funds to roof one new church every six days?! And did you know that Cliff and Val also served in Russia and Mongolia and organised many fly-n-build teams?

Always positive, full of so much energy, so much goodwill, Cliff was also obsessed with full accountability with donor funding. Who could ever say 'no' to Cliff, when he was fundraising for VIA! He had such a wonderful and genuine heart.

Cliff had a clear view of the world and the things that were within his ability to impact. He invested time and effort where he could make a difference. He lived a structured and disciplined life. He approached all tasks determined to give his absolute best - whether he was exercising, teaching, leading out at church or providing for his family.

He has lived his life with a strong work ethic, a service mindset, a practical approach that is "all-in" and committed to giving his best. By God's grace, Cliff's life was a life well lived. We look forward to seeing him again soon.

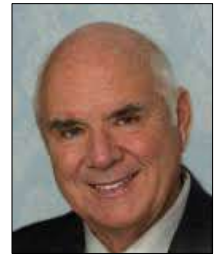

From Drug Addict to Church Pastor

My name is Eric Papaol, and this is my testimony a story of how God rescued me from the streets and transformed my life for His glory.



I was born and raised in a strong Seventh-day Adventist home. My father was a pastor, and like many pastor's children, everyone believed I would naturally follow in his footsteps. As a young boy, that was my dream too, but life took me down a very different path.

I was an average student in school. After completing grade six, I went on to high school. However, in grade nine my life changed dramatically. I was expelled along with several other students after we were caught smoking something strictly forbidden at the school. Instead of learning from that mistake, bitterness grew in my heart. I made a personal vow that day: I would never stop smoking, because I blamed my expulsion on that very habit.

Soon after, I left the church entirely. What started as smoking, quickly spiralled into drug and alcohol addiction. I found myself living like a street kid, earning the nickname "Streets." My friends and I would do whatever was necessary to support our addictions, even stealing from people's houses at night and selling the stolen goods just to buy cigarettes, drugs, and alcohol.

My drinking worsened over time. I was arrested multiple times and spent many nights in police cells. Although I never ended up in the main prison, my life was clearly headed toward destruction. Even after getting married and having children, my addictions continued. Because of my Christian upbringing, I would occasionally return to church but never sincerely, never fully surrendered. In total, I spent almost 30 years of my life outside the church.

Then came the turning point. On October 2, 2017, after another round of drug use, while high on marijuana, something happened that changed everything. In that broken, desperate state, I cried out to God. I prayed earnestly and asked Him to change me to save me, because I could not save myself.

God heard my cry. From that moment, He delivered me completely from drugs, alcohol, and cigarettes. It was not my strength, it was His power alone. I began attending church regularly and slowly became involved in church activities. As my faith grew stronger, I was appointed as a church elder. From that time onward, I never looked back. I can truly

say: the man I once was no longer exists. Praise God!

In 2023, my local church sponsored me to attend a Laymen Training School hosted by our local mission. After two months of training, I returned home with a deeper passion to serve God. That training stirred something within me. Under the conviction of the Holy Spirit, I felt clearly called to ministry.

I then enrolled at Omaura Adventist School of Ministry in the Eastern Highlands Province of Papua New Guinea. After two years of studies, I graduated with a Certificate in Ministry. Today, I am serving as a local church pastor under the VIA program at Pawa SDA Church.

My life is living proof that God can rescue anyone even someone lost on the streets, bound by addiction, and without hope. He turned my broken past into a testimony of grace and transformed me into a humble servant in His vineyard.

I praise God for His mercy, His patience, and His leading in my life. By His grace, I will continue to serve Him faithfully until He comes in the clouds of glory to take His people home. To God be all the glory.

New Adventist Church Build in Lutheran Territory

During the second week of preaching, at the end Elias and his family were baptized, accepting Adventist truth, willing to keep the bible Sabbath. Many Lutherans are converted now and the church is planning for a big baptism and Church dedication.

VIA Starts New School

In 2013, VIA missionary Linus Keforo and his family moved into a village near where they lived, to worship with three people there. One man was baptised while the other man and his wife were new interests.

Five years later, in 2018, one of the church members invited the VIA to go with him to visit a primary school site. Some of the school was built in 2016. The villagers wanted to build two teachers' houses and a duplex classroom. The house and the classroom were to be built with bush materials, but the school did not start because the villagers were undecided which agency would run the school.

After seeing the school the VIA asked the church member, Mr Sylvester Tepino, (who was also the landowner), if they could start a Seventh-day Adventist mission school.



The church member agreed and the school was started in 2019 with grades three and four. The first teachers to teach there were Mr and Mrs Aite. Mr Kenneth Aite was the head teacher and his wife Rita as his assistant.

We praise God that the first grade eight students of this school—Wawuning S.D.A Primary School—are now doing their grade ten at Wogum Secondary School at Wewak, East Sepik Province, P.N.G..
